3 / 4-Year-Old Government Funding

Funding has now been allocated for all current 3- year olds attending Scallywags. For any child who has their 3rd Birthday between 1st January and 31st March – application forms will be handed out in February. Please ensure you complete these forms in order to be eligible for funding after Easter. Any parent who thinks they may are excellent teaching tools. Nursery rhymes and be eligible for 30 free hours, is advised to look at the Childcare Choices website: www.childcarechoices.gov.uk development and they provide a fun way to support to register and gain an eligibility code. Expansion to early years funding from 1st April

Following the announcement of the Spring 2023 Budget, the financial support that is going to be available to parents is a follow:

Stage 1 - From April 2024, working parents of 2-year-olds work that the RSPB do. During will be able to access 15 hours childcare support.

Stage 2 - From September 2024, working parents of children from the age of 9 months to 3-year-olds will be able to access 15 hours childcare support.

Stage 3 - From September 2025, working parents of children form 9 months to school age will be entitled to 30 hours of childcare a week.

Once we have received the funding figures from the local Chinese New Year is council, we will get in contact will all parents to 2-yearolds to discuss funding options that they may be eligible for from April 2024.

Handwashing day – Wednesday 10th January

Today we will be teaching the children all about the importance of hand hygiene along with how to wash their hands correctly.

The children will be germ detectives today. They will

be playing the glitter hand washing game and the pom pom sneeze game to help them understand how easily germs are spread and how important the catch it, kill it, bin it, approach is.

They will be making daffodils, researching symbols of Wales and Saint David respectively and making Welsh


Mother's week – 4th March

Pantosaurus helps children understand that their body belongs to them, and they should tell someone they trust if anything makes them feel upset or worried. Today we will be talking PANTS with the children:

- P Pants are private
- A Always remember your body belongs to you
- N No means no
- T Talk about secrets that upset you
- S Speak up someone can help you

Dealing with sick children...

Please can we politely ask that all sick children are kept off nursery for the designated exclusion time / or until they are fully better.

We ask that if your child has any of the following, they are kept at home and do not return to nursery until they are completely well in themselves again:

- . Temperature (38c and above)
- . Coughs / colds / sore throat / fatigue
- . Rashes
